



BCI Events – Terms & Conditions

Battery Council International (BCI) Registration Terms & Conditions apply to all BCI events including but not limited to the annual BCI Convention + Power Mart Expo, the Environmental Health and Safety Conference, and Flow Batteries North America.

Prior to your registration for any BCI event, you must acknowledge and accept the Terms & Conditions contained herein. Should you not wish to accept the Terms & Conditions you should not register.

Submission of a registration is regarded as affirmation of your acceptance of the Terms & Conditions.

BCI Code of Conduct

We are committed to a safe, productive, and welcoming environment that is inclusive and free from discrimination, regardless of race, religion, color, national origin, sexual orientation, gender expression or identity, transgender status, age, disability, veteran or marital status, or any other protected categories under applicable law. Participants, including, but not limited to, attendees, speakers, media, volunteers, exhibitors, service providers, and all others must abide by the following policy:

Expected Behavior

- Be considerate of those around you and collaborative with others.
- Be respectful of others and their viewpoints that may be different from your own.
- Be mindful of your words and actions at all times.

Unacceptable behaviors may include, but are not limited to:

- Offensive or unwanted behavior or language related to, but not limited to, race, religion, color, national origin, sexual orientation, gender expression or identity, transgender, status, age, disability, veteran or marital status, or any other similar categories.
- Visual harassment, such as sexual images or sexual language including content in presentations such as video, PowerPoint slides, and other items.
- Sexual harassment of any kind, such as unwelcome sexual advances or words/actions of a sexual nature.
- Wearing attire that includes harmful or offensive language or imagery that is not appropriate for a professional setting.
- Disruption of presentations by others, including during sessions or speeches at receptions.
- Abusive action directed at an individual, such as threats, intimidation, or bullying, both online and/or in-person.
- Sharing your registration credentials with any other person(s).

- Any unauthorized recording of presentations or other sessions. Any use of video, audio, or
 photography from the event requires express written consent from BCI. Conference attendees are
 welcome to take photos for personal use, however any commercial use requires written consent.
 This includes but is not limited to publication in newspapers and magazines, subscription-based or
 ad supported websites, e-mail newsletters, and marketing materials unrelated to BCI.
- Misusing in-session Q&A or other attendee education opportunities is prohibited, including self
 promotion, inappropriate or unrelated questions, or public attempts to gain comment for third-party
 publications unrelated to BCI.
- Making event content available to a competitor of BCI, or making commercial use of any materials
 used in BCI marketing, session presentations or other event-related collateral.
- Possession of a weapon or something that could be construed as a weapon both online and/or in person.
- Possession or mention of illegal substances both online and/or in-person.
- Inappropriate comments or stalking of fellow attendees.
- Nudity is prohibited.
- Any other illegal activity not already covered above.

BCI has zero-tolerance for any form of discrimination or harassment, including but not limited to sexual harassment by participants or our staff at our meetings. If you are the subject of, or witness to any violations, contact onsite staff or send an email to info@batterycouncil.org.

Consequences of Unacceptable Behavior

Unacceptable behavior will not be tolerated and could result in debarment from current, and/or any future (BCI) events. If a participant is found or reasonably believed to be engaging in unacceptable behavior, (BCI) may take any action they deem appropriate, up to and including expulsion from the event and venue without warning or refund. If appropriate, local law enforcement may get involved.

Liability Waiver & Release

In consideration of being allowed to register for, and participate in BCI events, you hereby warrant and represent that you are age 21 or above and freely waive, release from liability, assume all risks, and covenant not to sue BCI or its members, employees, board members, agents, or volunteers for any expense, loss, damage, personal injury, including loss of life, illness, disability, property damage, or property theft or actions of any kind that you may hereafter suffer or sustain before, during, or after the event, unless said expense, loss, damage, personal injury, including loss of life, illness, disability, property damage or property theft or actions of any kind is caused by the sole, gross negligence of BCI. This Liability Waiver & Release is specifically binding upon your heirs and assigns and is knowingly given.

Public Health

By registering for BCI events, you can attest at the time of your arrival that you will abide by the requirements set forth by BCI and by federal, state, or local health authorities.

Photography/Video of Attendees

On occasion, you may be photographed, video-taped, or audio-taped in connection with BCI activities. As a participant of any BCI event, you agree that BCI is the sole owner of all rights in and to the resulting photographs, video footage and recordings, for all purposes related to BCI's business (both now and in the future). Your name and likeness may be used by BCI in advertising and promotional materials. Participants shall receive no compensation or royalties for appearance in any materials.

Data Privacy

As part of your registration, BCI will share the data you provide BCI with third party vendors in order to process your registration, to make you aware of goods and services you may be interested in, to perform analytics on behalf of BCI, in connection with the event and for such other purposes as BCI may approve from time to time.

Cancellation Policy

BCI will provide a full refund of registration fees, less an administrative processing fee of \$100 for any cancellations received in writing 90 days before any scheduled event begins. No refund will be provided for any cancellations received less than 90 days from the first scheduled session.

Cancellations should be directed to info@batterycouncil.org. Telephone cancellations are NOT accepted for refunds. Participant must obtain confirmation of receipt of email from BCI on or before the cancellation deadline. All refunds will be processed within 30 days from when cancellation request is received to the original form of payment. Substitutions of names of attendees can be made, without a fee, by contacting the registration team at info@batterycouncil.org. Hotel reservations must be canceled separately and directly with the hotel.

Battery Council International is consistently monitoring the COVID-19 safety guidelines, local regulations and travel restrictions for in-person events. In the event it is necessary for BCI to cancel the in-person portion of the conference through unexpected public health concerns, attendees will be refunded in full.
